For Fathers, Grandfathers, Godfathers: On Saturday June 18 and Sunday June 19, 2022, we will remember all of our fathers at the Divine Liturgies. There will be petitions for their health and continued blessings, and a requiem service (panachida) for all our fathers who have died, that the Lord God remembers them. If you wish to have your living or deceased father remembered during the Liturgies, please use the special envelope designated "Father's Day" and place it in the collection basket.

The Peter and Paul (Apostles) Fast begins on Monday after All Saints' Sunday (June 15) and lasts until June 28. The Typikon prescribes strict abstinence on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, with a mitigated abstinence (wine and oil) on Tuesday and Thursday. The Ruthenian Metropolia has identified this period as a penitential season (Canon 880, § 2). This fast may be observed voluntarily.
