

The Dormition Fast. The Dormition Fast. Tomorrow, August 1 we begin the two week fast in preparation for the final feast of the Church year: the Dormition or falling asleep of the Most Holy Theotokos. This feast is commonly referred to as the "summer Pascha." This fast will last until August 15.

The Feast of the Transfiguration of Our Lord. On Saturday, August 6, we will celebrate the Divine Liturgy of the Transfiguration, followed by the blessing of fruit. We bless the first fruit of the harvest as a giving back to the Lord what is His and has come from Him. We ask you to bring your own basket of fruit to the church to be blessed. A table will be set up in the front of the church for baskets to be blessed.

The cores and the peel of fruit should be buried in the garden and not thrown in the rubbish bin.
